INTRODUCTION

As a first step towards the formalized development planning of the Cochin region, an advisory committee was set up in 1965. In the same year itself, a Joint Town Planning Committee was constituted for their planning & development and this committee has been elevated into a trust viz. Cochin Town Planning Trust under the Chairmanship of the District Collector. In the course of time, the authorities were convinced of the fact that a larger set up is required to control the growth of the Cochin City and its environs in a planned manner which resulted in the formation of GCDA in the year 1976.

The Greater Cochin Development Authority came into existence on 24.1.1976 under the Madras Town Planning Act of 1920 and Travancore Town Planning Act IV of 1108 read with G.O. (MS) No.19/76/LA & SWD dated 23.1.1976. Whereas in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 51 of the Kerala Town and Country Planning Act, 2016 (9 of 2016), the Greater Cochin Development Authority has been constituted as per notification issued under G.O(P) No. 47/2016/LSGD dated 16th December 2016 and published as SRO No. 756/2016 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 2180 dated 16th December 2016. This is a body coming under the Local Self Government Department of the Kerala and now guided by clause 51-60 of Kerala Town and Country Planning Act 2016 vide notification 19904/Leg C1/2013/Law dated 17th March 2016.

The jurisdiction of GCDA covers an area of 732 sq.kms consisting of Kochi Corporation 6 Municipalities and 33 Panchayaths. Subsequently, Goshree Island Development Authority (GIDA) was constituted vide G.O.(MS) No.114/94/LAD dated 18.5.1994 comprising 8 Island Panchayaths and two wards of Cochin Corporation viz: Thanthonnithuruthu and Fort Vyppin having an area of 100 sq.kms and thus delimiting the jurisdictional area of GCDA to 632 sq.kms.

Corporation: Kochi except Fort Vypeen, Gundu Island and Thanthonnithuruthu

<u>Municipalities:-</u> Aluva, North Parur, Angamali, Perumbavoor, Tripunithura Kalamassery,

Maradu, Thrikkakara and Eloor.

Panchayaths:- Chellanam, Kumbalanghi, Mulanthuruthi, Cheranelloor, Kumbalam,

Udayamperoor, Vadavucode-Puthencruz, Vazhakulam, Choornikara, Edathala, Keezhmadu, Chengamanad, Sreemoolanagaram, Alangad, Kadungalloor, Ezhikkara, Kottuvally, Nedumbassery, Kanjoor, Varapuzha

and Chottanikkara.

Before the Town and Country Planning Act, 2016 came into existence the following were specific function /missions of GCDA.

- 1. To guide urban development by checking urban sprawl and promoting healthy growth of urban and rural areas through long term, short term and action area oriented detailed development plans.
- 2. Preparation and notification of draft general and Detailed Town Planning Schemes in consultation with the Town Planning Department.
- 3. Implementation of General and Detailed Town Planning Schemes sanctioned by Government.
- 4. To co-ordinate the activities of the various agencies. (After the 73rd and 74th Constitutional Amendment Act and subsequent Kerala Municipalities Act of 1994, the role of GCDA is to be redefined). Promulgation of new Town and Country Planning ordinance 2014 states that the Development Authorities already constituted shall continue.
- 5. To monitor and implement the plans and proposals through public participation, timely revision and by prioritizing proposals.
- 6. To determine the phasing of development, providing open spaces and recreational facilities depending on the needs of the region.

The present functions of GCDA after the act came into existence are:-

- i) Preparation and implementation of land re-adjustment or land pooling or land banking schemes for the purpose of implementation of projects in the Development Authority area, in tune with the provisions of this Act.
- ii) Promoting planned development as envisaged in the Plans for the development authority area, through tools like Transfer of Development Right, accommodation, reservation etc.
- iii) Set-up special function agencies, if required, & guide, direct & assist them on matters pertaining to their respective functions.
- iv) Co-ordination of implementation of plans under this Act in the Development Authority area.
- v) Perform such other functions as are supplemental, incidental or consequential to items (i) to (iii)above or as may be directed by the Government, the District Planning Committee or the Metropolitan Planning Committee, as the case may be from time to time.

Kerala Development Authority Rules – 2015

The Governor of Kerala has promulgated the Kerala Town & Country Planning Ordinance 2015 (6 of 2015) repealing the Town Planning Act 1108 ME (IV of 1108 ME) the Madras Town Planning Act, 1920 (Madras Act Vii of 1920) and the Travancore Town and Country Planning Act 1120. Thus Kerala Development Authorities Rules 1984 ceased to operate. The Kerala Development Authorities rules 2015 came into force on the 23rd day July 2015 on the basis of the Government order No. G.O.(P) No. 242/2015/LSGD. The functioning of this Authority is governed by the KDA rule 2015.

The Town Planning Act (Act IV of 1108) & Chapter IX of Town Planning Act 2016

Chapter IX of the Town Planning Act 2016 (Act IV of 1108) also elaborates the powers of General Council, Executive Committee, Chairman and Secretary of the Authority. It also explains the mode of constitution of General Council and Executive Committee of the Authority and appointments of the Secretary and Chairman of the Authority.



Administration Department

The Administration Department functions as the co-ordinating agency between various departments for expeditious disposal of the business and it exercises general supervision and control and enforces discipline.

This department is functioning under the control of the Administrative Officer. The entire matters to be placed before the Executive Committee and General Council of GCDA are routed through this department. Establishment & General Section, Office Section, Record Section, Library etc. are working under this department.

A Legal Section is also functioning under the Administration Department. It deals with all cases arising from the matters dealt with by GCDA except Land Acquisition cases. Land Acquisition cases are dealt separately in Estate Department. As on 15.07.2021 a total number of 4 cases are pending before the Hon'ble Supreme Court, 348 cases before High Court, 195 cases before Lower Courts and 43 cases before Legal Forum.

Estate Wing

Estate department is responsible for the proper management of GCDA's all properties viz. land and buildings. The main functions of this department are allotment/disposal of land, houses, shops and office rooms, allotment of various grounds, stadium, community hall etc. for programmes, tendering/auction of parking spaces, taking possession of acquired land, assignment of purambokku land, Rehabilitation of Kudikidappukar and small holders, mutation of various

revenue records in respect of land acquired by the Authority under various schemes with the help of LA Special Thahasildar. This department is also responsible for attending LAR's/LAAs cases filed against Awards of LAO under various schemes.

Planning Department

Planning Department is headed by Senior Town Planner who is technically assisted by Town Planners who are in charge of various planning cells. There is an administrative section which is headed by Section Officer/Superintendent who deals with files and correspondence. Town Planners as head of planning cells are assisted by Deputy Town Planners, Assistant Town planners, Draughtsman/Surveyors. Duties under taken by planning departments are preparation of project reports, investigation and initiation of new schemes and projects, feasibility study, architectural design of buildings, MP/MLA fund works, carrying out scientific study reports, technical guidance to local bodies and Kochi Metro and preparation of final survey sketches of allotted plots.

Now that new Kerala Town and Country Planning Act 2016 is passed by Kerala Assembly and Kerala Development authorities rules have also come into existence to carry out the functions mentioned in the introduction for which planning department has the major role.

Engineering Department

The Engineering Department is functioning under the control and guidance of the Superintending Engineer. There are four divisions under this department. The administration of this department is under the supervision of the Section Officer/Superintendent and the drawing branch is under the Head Draftsman. Various scheme proposals of GCDA formulated by the Planning Department are implemented by the Engineering Department. A brief description of the functions of this department is furnished below:

The Engineering Department of GCDA is solely responsible for Engineering Design, planning, Analysis of Cost, Estimation, sanctions, contract management, Execution, Supervision & Maintenance of Construction activities, Monitoring along with Asset management, maintenance of Roads, Buildings, Movable and immovable assests of GCDA and other DTP Scheme Areas under jurisdiction of GCDA.

The Department also extends consultancy services in planning, and Engineering expertise to urban local bodies and institutions. The Department oversees works related to public –private partnership (PPP), BOT schemes etc with alternative financial support.

The Department is divided into divisions including one electrical wing.

Each Division is divided into Sub divisions under the control of AEE & each sub division in turn is divided into a number of sections under the charge of Assistant Engineers, assisted by overseers.

Also, in addition to above, the Department has Drawing branch & Accounts branch. The Drawing branch comprises of Technical Assistants, Assistant Engineers (Works) assisted by Draftsman's, which deals with contracts, bidding, tendering etc.

The Quality Control lab is under the control of this department. It is equipped with essential quality testing equipments mandatory as per quality standards.

Functions and Responsibilities of Engineering Department in General.

- a) To plan, organize, and co-ordinate works related to the Engineering Department based on budget allocation & Government sanctioned project.
- b) To ensure that, polices of GCDA and the Government with regard to developmental activities of the regions are implemented in a timely manner.
- c) Advise GCDA, in all technical matters under the control of the Engineering Department.
- d) To execute and inspect major works/projects under taken by GCDA for its timely completion and quality.
- e) Exercise financial & technical power delegated to Engineers.

- f) To prepare detailed project reports (technical) for the major works undertaken by the GCDA and also to have system of monitoring for the progress of work and to give directions for taking appropriate corrective steps wherever required.
- (g) To prepare Detailed estimates for projects and further verification of the correctness of the estimates and adequacy of the provision and give instructions wherever required.
- (h) Invite tenders as per rules and to make contract arrangement for proper execution of work to government specified standards.
- (i) To arrange periodical payments and to watch expenditure under cost control techniques.
- (j) To submit reports & estimates for development, maintenance or repair works of existing Assets of GCDA to improve conditions of structures.
- (k) To approve the procedures for proper implementation of the construction activities related to soil condition, foundation adopted, concrete mix, materials at site, structural design etc.
- (l) Adopt the relevant Quality measures and to ensure proper quality of works as per specifications and for achieving designed life of the structure.
- (m) Setting out works/checking the same to see that works are carried out according to approved plan.
- (n) Scrutinizing contractor's bill & recording accounts of materials, if any, issued for work.
- (o) Supervising the progress of work and taking steps to remove bottle necks, if any.
- (p) Preparing and submitting valuation report of building & structures as required for acquiring lands etc.
- (q) To fix rents as per the guidelines prescribed for the assets under the jurisdiction of GCDA & scheme areas.

Finance & Accounts Department

The Finance and Accounts Department is instrumental in raising the required funds for the Authority from Government and other financial institutions like banks, HUDCO, KURDFC etc. This department manages the financial resources of the Authority for the effective implementation of the various scheme proposals and infrastructural development projects envisaged in the annual budget of the Authority.

Rent from various commercial spaces, office spaces and shops enhanced land compensation, income from sale of plots under various schemes, centage charges etc. are the main source of income of the Authority.

In order to cope up with the growing responsibility in the collection of rent of shops and other commercial and office spaces a separate section viz. Revenue section was organized under the immediate supervision of 3 section officers/Superintendent. For speedy disposal of the files relating to various housing schemes and loan schemes, the term of instalments/repayment of which have elapsed, a separate cell viz. Revenue Closing Cell has also been created under the supervision of a superintendent. The above said revenue section and revenue closing cell are under the control of the Assistant Administrative Officer (Finance & Revenue).

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF MAJOR SCHEMES BEING PLANNED/ <u>IMPLEMENTED IN THE F.Y. 2019-20</u>

1. Land Bank Project

Preparation and implementation of land re-adjustment or land pooling or land banking schemes for the purpose of implementation of projects in the Development Authority area in tune with provision of the act is one of the powers and functions of authority. Now GCDA is planning to concentrate on urban peripheral area coming under GCDA for its sustainable planned development. Due to the scarcity of bulk land for implementation of planned residential development projects, especially in the peripheral area of Greater Kochi, GCDA envisages land bank/pooling scheme for the purpose of planned residential development in the peripheral areas as well as to enhance the Transit Oriented Development (TOD) based on recently introduced Mass Rapid Transport System (MRTS) that is Kochi Metro Rail. It was proposed to procure bulk land either by land bank or by land pooling scheme. Accordingly an Expression of Interest (EOI) was invited from land owners who are willing to offer the land for planned urban development. Consequently GCDA has received 3 such EOI s and official evaluation site inspections were conducted. The further policy level decision and steps for the possibility of acquiring the land is under progress.

2. Kochi Economic city

The Kochi Economic City Project is a prestigious one which was declared in 2019-2020 budget of Govt. of Kerala and GCDA was entrusted to take up the project. The proposal was to develop Satellite Townships connecting Municipalities and Panchayaths within the Jurisdictional area of GCDA. Accordingly, a preliminary report was prepared with the aid of nearby Engineering Colleges and submitted to Government. Thereafter a meeting was conducted on 03/12/2019 with LSGD Minister and a concept presentation was done by GCDA officials and Government ordered to take further necessary steps by submitting a detailed plan for the successful implementation of project. As per the instruction from the Govt. GCDA collaborated with Department of Architecture &

Planning of Govt. Engineering College, Thrissur, and entrusted them to do preliminary socio-economic survey and land use survey.

Initially ten sites were identified and after the first round to elimination based on various aspects like location, future urban growth direction, availability of land etc. selected four sites for detailed study. Later a set of 24 parameter were identified for ranking of these four sites. Then, conducted a site inspection and put scores for these parameters and ranked these sites. Consequently, the site abutting NH-544 near Athani spreading over an area of 1100 acres of land in Nedumbassery and Chengamanadu village was selected as the projects site.

Govt. Engineering College was decided to conduct the socio-economic survey and land use survey between March 15 and March 30, 2020. But due to the covid 19 pandemic and imposing of lockdown by the Government thereafter, the survey works could not take place.

Later it came to know form the printed media that, Government of Kerala has accorded Administrative Sanction to develop a Global Industrial Finance and Trade (GIFT) city spreading over an area of 220 Ha nearby Aluva along the NH and allocated Rs. 540 Crore for land acquisition. The project is initiated as part of the Kochi-Bengaluru Industrial corridor and the Rs. 1600 Crore project has already been approved by National Industrial Corridor Development and Implementation Trust(NICDIT).

It was realized that, the aims and objectives of GIFT city is similar to that of KEC project proposed by GCDA. In this context, the policy decisions are required to reorganize the aims and objectives of the project.

3. Exhibition Cum Convention Centre At Manapattiparambu

Proposal is for the construction of exhibition cum convention centre in the land owned by GCDA Kaloor area DTP scheme. Steps were taken to implement the project in PPP mode by inviting REP and later by executing lease deed but due to various technical difficulties it was dropped and EC decision was taken to implement the project using GCDA fund in the 210 cents of land. The building plan has been prepared and submitted to Kochi Corporation on 20.01.2020. A new preliminary feasibility report for project has been submitted to the Govt and approval is pending. As per the G.O(Rt) No. 761/1999/LAD dated, 03.03.1999 the scheme map was prepared and the sanction wa still

pending from the Govt. Under this circumstances authority forwarded a request to the Govt. on 10.03.2020 showing details for variation of the scheme. Further steps can only be taken after getting administrative sanction and approval of revised scheme map from the Govt.

4. Godown cum office Complex at Kaloor(Shopping Cum Office Complex)

GCDA proposed to construct a godown cum office complex in the 30 cents of land owned by authority under Kaloor DTP Scheme. The plot is having a good access with 10m wide roads on both. Therefore, GCDA decided to construct a Godown cum Office complex building for private/public utilities. The proposed building plan is completed and is ready to submit for building permit in Kochi Corporation. The total built up area of building is 756.90sqm. in two floors with all basic amentities in compliance with KMBR 2019. Further steps can only be taken after getting administrative sanction.

5. LIFE MISSION

The Greater Cochin Development Authority (GCDA) has decided to rehabilitate families of P&T Colony living along Perandoor canal as a part of slum rehabilitation. The project is proposed under the life mission scheme of the state Government for the homeless. GCDA proposed to construct 88 dwelling units with common amenities of Recreation hall, Reading room, Creche, Feeding Room, Sick room etc. for the 82 beneficiaries and allocated GCDA owned land having an extent of 70 cents at Rameswaram West DTP Scheme. Building permits and administrative sanction has been obtained. The total floor area of this G+3 building project is 61,000 sqft. Project Management Consultant(PMC) for the project FRBL(FACT, RCF Building Products Limited) as per the estimate of the PMC, the construction cost is about 15.84 Crore. Life mission has granted Rs. 10.5 lakhs/unit and additional Rs. 1.5 lakhs/unit has been granted under PMAY(U) scheme, balance fund will be mobilized by GCDA from CSR fund and sponsorships. The piling work has started and is expected to complete by June and the works of superstructure can start by July 1st week.

6. STUDY ON ECO TOURISM VILLAGE AT RAMESWARM

The Eco Tourism Village project is proposed in 12.7 acres of land owned by GCDA in Rameswaram DTP Scheme area. For effective utilization of land for environment friendly eco-tourism project it was decided to conduct detailed study regarding the project. The land is marshy and is habitat of different species of mangroves. The land is under CRZ-IA and this zone is prohibited for certain type of construction. Under this circumstances GCDA submitted a request to Kerala Coastal Zone Management Authority (KCZMA) to change this zone to CRZ II. But the request was declined by KCZMA and they have not changed the land to CRZ II. Now, GCDA again approached KCZMA, then GCDA was asked to present the matter during the hearing which is going to conduct soon.

7. Marine Drive Entertainment Hub

GCDA had proposed this project so as to upgrade Marine Drive with entertainment facilities for people of all age groups and also priority was given for the upkeep and maintenance of Marine Drive. As GCDA was in the process, Cochin Smart City Mission Limited had approached GCDA with their proposal of 'Open space corridor linking Darbar Hall ground to Mangalavanam'. In this proposal, CSML plans to re-lay the broken tiles, provide proper seating, street scape and landscape at Marine Drive and provide required Entertainment facilities for the visitors. After considering the proposal in detail, GCDA has given CSML the required permission and CSML has about to complete the work.

8. STUDY TO REDUCE TRACFFIC CONGESTION AT ALUVA

Aluva witnesses a heavy traffic congestion during the major part of the day making it uneasy for the communters, both physically and mentally. In order to find a solution to this, GCDA had proposed this project in which a detailed study would be conducted by an expert agency and solution to reduce the traffic congestion shall be recommended. GCDA has selected NATPAC as the agency for the study but work order has not been issued as Aluva MLA Sri Anwar Sadath had informed GCDA that the study shall be taken up using some other fund.

Later, by considering the requests of merchant associations, area councilor and opinions from various socio-cultural-business personalities, it was decided to study the feasibility of bridge at Kadathukadavu across the periyar river connecting the Bank Jn and Paravur Jn, There after Eol has been invited from competent Govt. agencies such as NATPAC, KITCO for the feasibility study. The received Eols under the evaluation procedure.

9. OPEN GYM AT JAWHARLAL NEHRU INTERNATIONAL STADIUM (JNIS)

GCDA had proposed to install open Gym at appropriate spaces in JNIS that would enhance and help in maintaining a healthy lifestyle. GCDA planning wing had collected the required data on the installation of open Gym and had also earmarked an appropriate space at JNIS where it could be installed. The proposal had been forward to Engineering for tender procedure.

As the procedure was being carried out, DMO approached GCDA with their proposal of Open gym and after discussing the proposal in detail with the DMO, GCDA allotted 75m² land near the stadium. DMO installed the Gym equipment and the project was inaugurated on No. 1, 2020 by Hon. Chairman of GCDA.

10. CHILAVANNOR BUND ROAD

The proposal is to develop a new road parallel to Sahodharan Ayyappan road for decongesting the SA road. The proposed Chilavannoor Bund Road connects Thykoodam Junction at NH Bypass and Thevara Junction at M.G.Road. It is located in the southern side of SA Road. The Authority aim to acquire land as part of this project and this acquisition proposal have already been forwarded to Government for necessary approval. It is decided to acquire the required land through Land Acquisition provision and Land Acquisition department has started the work for the process of acquisition. GCDA has submitted the proposal to the District Collector and he has instructed the Land Acquisition Tahsildar to take necessary actions on the same and LA wing of GCDA is in the process of the same. Then GCDA approached Cochin Corporation for the implementation, it was informed by the Mayor that, GCDA has to take steps to avail the State Govt. fund earmarked for the development of Roads in Kochi City.

Now GCDA is exploring possibilities to acquire the land using the land pooling method, the detailed proposal will be submitted to Government soon.

11.MULTI LEVEL CAR PARKING AT JAWAHARLAL NEHRU INTERNATIONAL STADIUM

GCDA proposes a Multilevel Car Parking at Jawaharlal Nehru International Stadium considering the increased demand for car parking during the international/national matches conducted at stadium and also due to increased vehicular movement, lack of parking spaces at commercial and office buildings in and around the stadium. GCDA has earmarked about 50 cents of land for the project, which is zoned for mixed (commercial/residential) use. The project is proposed on PPP mode and the technical/financial feasibility studies are being carried out by GCDA.

12. KAKKANAD SHOPPING COMPLEX RECONSTRUCTION

The existing shopping complex of GCDA at Thrikkakara near Collectorate is very old and in a dilapidated condition. It is proposed to reconstruct the building in a better way. Design for the proposed shopping complex is prepared and submitted application for building permit to the Thrikkakara Municipality and the Building permit is awaited.

13. AMBEDKAR STADIUM

The Ambedkar stadium owned by GCDA has been the venue for several football matches including the Santhosh Trophy football tournament in its glorious past. Though it's a prime open land in the CBD of the city, the stadium is not effectively utilized. Due to the lack of proper drainage system and leveling up of adjoining plots the Stadium area gets flooded in the monsoon. This condition resulted in sinking of the existing stadium structure. The present situation warrants redevelopment to achieve the best utility of land there and thus redevelopment of Ambedkar stadium is included in the priority projects of GCDA considering the demand of people in and around Kochi for sports recreation and thus to ensure healthy community. It is envisaged to re-develop the stadium area covering the 6.9 acres after demarcating the land for the proposed ring road

around the stadium as per the approved layout plan and the newly built commercial building for resettlement of shops in the stadium. The proposed Sports City will be having the facilities of Football court, Hockey field, Basket Ball Court, Volley Ball Court, Swimming Pool, Indoor Stadium(for Badminton, Table Tennis etc.). Gymnasium, Dormitories for ladies and Gents, Lockers, Medical Room, Cafeteria and Administration Office. The Sports City will be providing parking area for at least 100 cars and 10 buses. GCDA is planning to invite Expression of Interest(EOI)from the developers who are passionate to develop and provide the sports facility in a social service manner.

The proposal has submitted to Government for the permission to lease the land, which is under the consideration of the Government.

14. ROPEWAY/CABLE CAR AT COCHIN MARINE DRIVE SCHEME

In order to enjoy the back water and the sunset from an eagle eye view for the tourists, GCDA envisages to construct a Ropeway/Cable Car. This cable car will be connecting Marine Drive maidan to Bolgatty Island across the backwaters. The project is proposed on PPP basis and GCDA is in the initial state of the project. GCDA has submitted a brief project proposal to the Government for in-principle sanction.

15. Implementation of Pradan Manthri Awas Yogan (PMAY)

GCDA was appointed as Nodal agency for implementation of PMAY in 21 gramapanchayats coming under GCDA jurisdiction by Kudumbasree via G.O(Rt) No. 3059/2018/LSGD dated 02.12.2018. GCDA prepared DPR for 118 beneficiaries of Amrithakudeeram and the DPR has been forwarded to State Level Appraisal Committee.

16. SHE HOSTEL

A lot of people, especially women travel to the city for various reasons like in search of job, education, personal and so on. During all such travels, women find it difficult in finding a safe and responsible place to stay. Taking cognizance of such situation, GCDA has proposed to construct a "SHE HOSTEL" in its land of 23 cents (approx.) situated close to Ernakulam South Railway station using own fund. The preparation of building plan of four storeyed building with 50-60 bed with common amenities is in the final stage. The financial feasibility study is to be done.

17. AFFORDABLE HOUSING SCHEME

GCDA proposes to provide affordable houses for various income groups in the land in possession of GCDA. Steps has been taken to identify the various land that are lying vacant in various scheme area coming under GCDA jurisdiction. Four sites has been identified after analyzing various factors such as fair value of land, zoning, pending litigations etc. The designing of DU and apartment tower is under preparation. The financial feasibility has to be worked out after the designing and calculation of tentative estimate.

18. <u>DIGITIZATION AND COMPUTERISATION OF RECORDS</u>

In order to manage the assets of GCDA efficiently and accurately a project named "Digitization of Assets and Computerization of Records" has initiated by GCDA. The project is to map all its assets including Land Parcels and Buildings using Q-GIS software in house and the details of the assets(Around 23 columns) will be given as attributes to each asset. The records has already been collected and computerized and the mapping of the land parcels are completed. The attributes from the planning dept. are incorporated and waiting for the information from Estate Department and Village Offices(Revenue Department). The aim is to put all the information in WebGIS.
